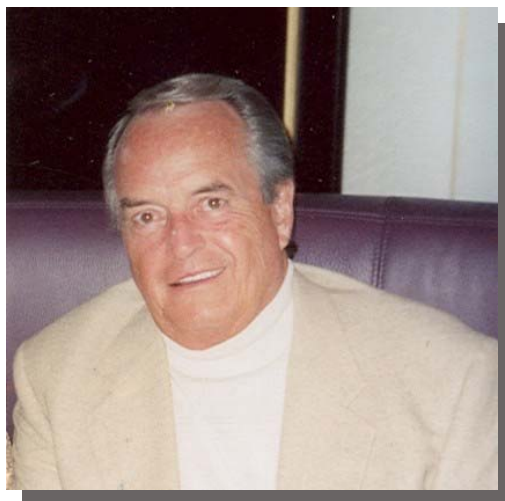

performance as an associate or officer. Bob promoted the program by phone and committed to donations of a minimum of 17 pins to launch the program.
